Objectives for week of March 18, 2024

Kindergarten Objectives

Reading - Students will be able to identify ALL beginning blends and ALL digraphs.

Students will be able to identify already learned sight words (41) I, am, a, in, be, no, the, it, can, me, to, and, is, see, did, at, big, said, the, like, has, up, we, play, make, get, was, what, not, my, you, he, look, run, she, of, here, go, are, do, come, for.

Students will be able to identify verbs, nouns, and adjectives; ALL reading comprehension skills (i.e. plot, sequence,

character, setting).

Writing - Students will be able to write their first and LAST name. Students will be able to independently write a five star sentence - 1. Capital letter; 2. Finger spaces; 3. Punctuation; 4. Written neatly; 5. Makes sense **Math** -Students will be able to identify subtraction sentences, subtraction sign, equals sign, difference.

Students will be able to subtract two numbers up to 5. Students will be able to count 1-100.

Science - Students will be able to identify living and nonliving things.

First Grade Objectives

Reading: Students will work on these comprehension skills: prediction, retell, characters, and making connections with the story. Students will identify and read words with ai, ay words. **Sight words:** Continue to practice sight words. **Writing:** Students will answer a writing prompt with multiple sentences. **Spelling words:** give on old my please pretty around say thank **Math:** Students will work on two digit addition and subtraction without regrouping **Practice +8 and +9** We will have math fact drills.

Second Grade Objectives

Reading: Students will be able to identify the main purpose of a text, including what the author wants to answer, explain, or describe.

Math: Students will be able to choose appropriate tools to estimate, measure, and compare lengths using customary units (inches, feet, and yards).

Spelling: Students will be able to spell and read words with vowel patterns -oo and -u. . **Spelling Words:** put, cook, stood, full, wood, July, shook, push, pull, brook, book, hood.

Writing: Students will be working on writing a friendly letter.

Mrs Miller's Resource Room Objectives

Reading: Students will identify and read the short i sound words in the story and identify the subject in a sentence.

Math: Students will practice subtraction word problems and subtraction facts.

Writing: Students will practice writing five star sentences and writing the letter Xx.

Second Grade

Reading: Students will practice /r/ controlled vowels /ar/ /or/ and /ore/ in a passage and identify nouns in a story when reading.

Math: Students will practice place value by using base ten blocks while adding and subtracting numbers.

Writing: Students will practice writing five detailed sentences in their journal while using the correct parts of a five star sentence to make a paragraph.

<u>Cougar Connections for March:</u> Honesty.
