Objectives for week of April 22, 2024

Kindergarten Objectives - End of Year Testing

Reading - Students will be able to identify ALL beginning blends, ALL digraphs.

Students will be able to identify ALL sight words (41) I, am, a, in, be, no, the, it, can, me, to, and, is, see, did, at, big, said, the, like, has, up, we, play, make, get, was, what, not, my, you, he, look, run, she, of, here, go, are, do, come, for. Students will be able to identify verbs, nouns, and adjectives; ALL reading comprehension skills (i.e. plot, sequence, character, setting). Writing - Students will be able to write their first and LAST name. Students will be able to independently write a five star sentence - 1. Capital letter; 2. Finger spaces; 3. Punctuation; 4. Written neatly; 5. Makes sense

Math -Students will be able to demonstrate graphing items. Students will be able to add and subtract two numbers up to 5. Students will be able to count **1-100**.

First Grade Objectives

Reading: Students will work on these comprehension skills: prediction, retell, characters, and making connections with the story. Students will identify and read words with ie and igh. **Sight words:** Continue to practice sight words. **Writing:** Students will answer a writing prompt with multiple sentences. **Spelling words:** like love off very would right write why says went stop **Math:** Students will learn to read data for graphing. We will have math fact drills.

Second Grade Objectives

Reading: Students will be able to identify plot and theme.

Math: Students will practice measurement skills to generate measurement data which they will display in a line plot. They will create and interpret bar graphs and picture graphs.

Spelling: Students will be able to spell and read regularly spelled two-syllable words with long vowels.

Spelling Words: downstairs, football, cowboy, houseboat, railroad, rainbow, boyhood, oatmeal, soybean, roadway, outplay, daydream.

Writing: Students will use adverbs that tell when and where.

Mrs Miller's Resource Room Objectives

First grade

Reading: Students will practice proper nouns in a passage and read long /a/ sound words in the story.

Math: Students will practice non-standard measurements and measure with a ruler.

Writing: Students will practice writing five star sentences and writing the letter Pp.

Second Grade

Reading: Students will practice Plural nouns and read passages and identify plural and singular nouns.

Math: Students will measure the length of an object by selecting and using appropriate tools.

Writing: Students will practice writing five detailed sentences in their journal while using the correct parts of a five star sentence to make a paragraph.
