First Grade Objectives

Second Grade Objectives

Reading-Students will review and identify the main purpose of a text, including what the author wants to answer, explain, or describe.

Writing-Students will continue to use the command of conventions of standard English, including capitalization, punctuation, and spelling in paragraph writing.

Math-Students will continue to learn how to tell time to five minutes, before and after the hour. Students will be introduced to flat surfaces, vertices, and edges when dealing with geometric objects.

Spelling-Students will review and apply decoding skills, such as recognizing word parts (e.g., roots and affixes, inflected endings, etc.) and the ability to decode multisyllable words.

No spelling words for the rest of the year!

LIBRARY OBJECTIVES FOR THE WEEK OF MAY 9-13

KINDERGARTEN: The students will read their Scholastic Let's Find Out magazine to describe how a seahorse's body helps it live in the ocean.
