Fifth Grade Objectives

Reading: Students will read <u>Exploding Ants</u> and be able to compare and contrast information from a text. Students will also be able to identify homophones and use them correctly.

Writing: Students will continue working on an expository writing piece about the seven continents. Students will be able to identify and use a graphic source. Students will also be able to identify pronouns and make them possessive.

Math: Students will be able to multiply a fraction by a whole number.

Science: Students will learn about weathering, erosion, and deposition. Students will also learn about rocks and minerals.

Social Studies: Students will continue to use the five themes of geography to study the regions of the United States. Each article presents a region of the United States and images of its important features.

Reading:

3rd Grade: Students will focus on writing legibly using commas, capitalization, spelling, and conjunctions. Students will work on reading and correcting sentences using their weekly spelling words. Students will read and answer comprehension and assessment questions.

4th Grade: Students will read various passages practicing sequence of events in addition to referencing materials to understand concepts of carrying out a procedure.

5th Grade: Students will work on reading and correcting sentences using their weekly spelling words. Students will also read and answer comprehension and assessment questions with short stories.

Writing:

3rd: Students will write fiction/non-fiction poetry establishing characters, setting, theme and relevancy.

4th: Students will focus on spelling words containing long E sounds in addition to focusing on legible writing using commas, capitalization, spelling, and conjunctions.

5th: Students will practice understanding parts of a text such as a noun, verb, adjective, adverb, subjects, predicates, precise punctuation, and line adherence.

Math:

3rd Grade: Students will continue to work with multiplication concepts and complete assessment this week.

4th Grade: Students will close out the Fraction Unit using number lines and completing a test over the concepts of fractions. Students will explore word problems and work with adding, subtracting with decimals.

5th Grade: Students will close out the Fraction Unit using number lines and completing a test over all the concepts of fractions. Students will explore word problems and work with adding and subtracting, and multiplying with decimals.

Spelling: Pre test on Friday February 2nd. Students have individualized words.
